

The Child Care and Development Program is a program funded by the Office of Child Care to provide funds for Native American Children to attend quality childcare programs.



The program is income based and available for children, ages 0-12 years, of Federally Recognized Tribal Citizens. Parents must make no more than 85% of the median income of the Commonwealth of Virginia. (Please refer to the table on back). The income limit is adjusted for family size. The child's primary residence must be in one of the following counties: Charles City, Chesterfield, Hanover, Henrico, James City, or New Kent. ### Program Goals

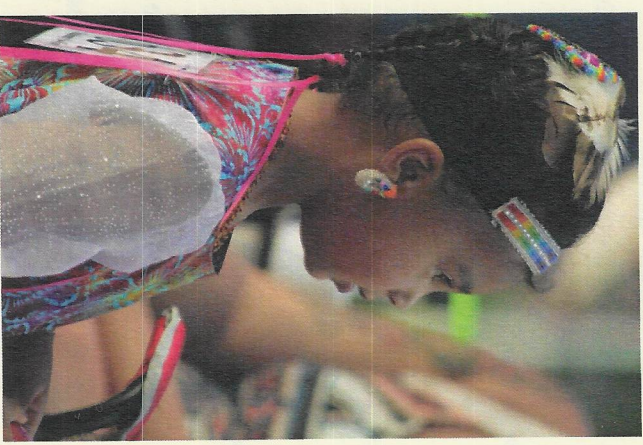
- Provide equal access to stable childcare for low-income families.
