## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

\*Per capita income is the mean income computed for every man, woman, and child in a particular group including those living in group quarters. It is derived by dividing the aggregate income of a particular group by the total population in that group.

\*Total # of ECCE sites include all licensed sites in Charles City. Out of 3, 2 accept public funding (VQB5 sites). Based on VQB5 data pulled September 2024.

\*ECCE capacity is based on licensed capacity (# of slots they are allowed to have) for centers and family day homes. For public schools, capacity is estimated based on current enrollment. Not all centers/day homes are at full capacity due to worker shortage.

\*Publicly funded sites are public schools and sites that receive Child Care Subsidy, and sites that accept at least one public funding stream (Head Start, Virginia Preschool Initiative, Mixed Delivery, and Child Care Subsidy).

\*VPI slots include the total for 4-year-olds (16) and 3-year-olds (12).

\*VPI, HS, and MD slot numbers are pulled from FY24/25 Virginia Department of Education Allocations.

\*Child Care Subsidy Program slot numbers based on FY24 pulled in October 2023

\*Pre-k experience includes Head Start, VPI, other public preschool, and private preschool/daycare.

\*90% of the brain is developed by age 5.

\*Virginia Quality Birth to Five (VQB5) measures and helps improve the quality of all publicly funded birth-to-five classrooms and supports families to choose quality programming across program types. Measures of quality are based on interactions and curriculum.
